

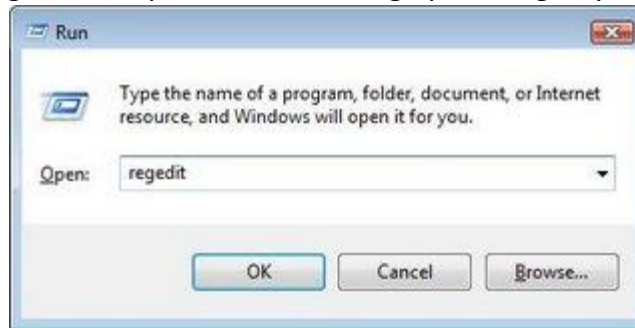
# USB to FireWire Adapter

## How to make Vista work with this adapter – Part#RR-527950

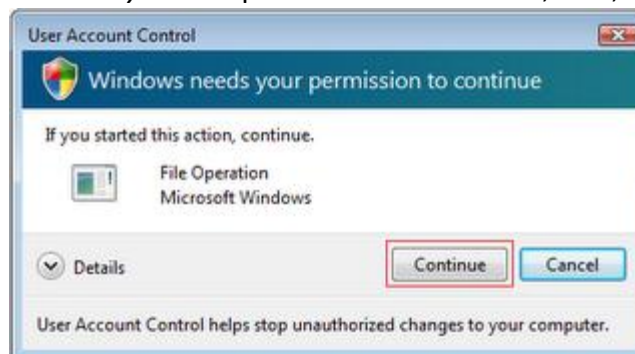

### Steps to resolve this issue

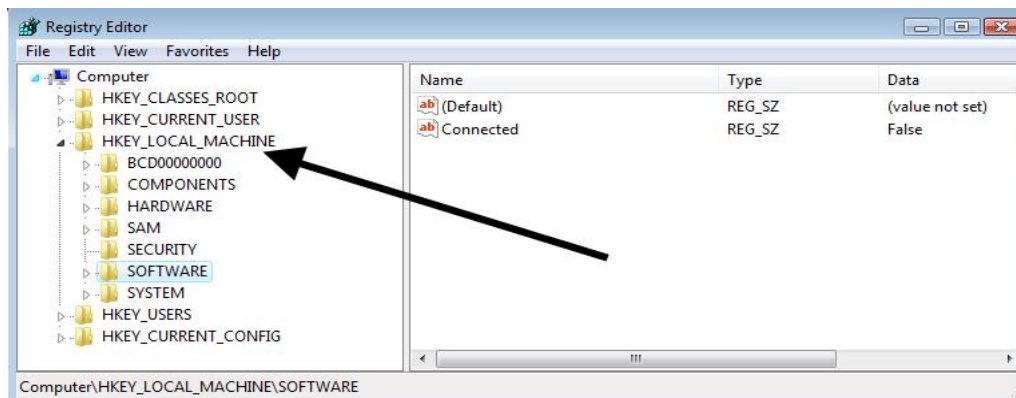
1. Click start and type "regedit" and press enter to bring up the Registry Editor.



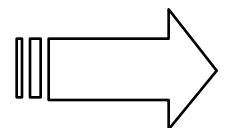
NOTE: User Account Control *may* ask for permission to continue, if so, click continue.



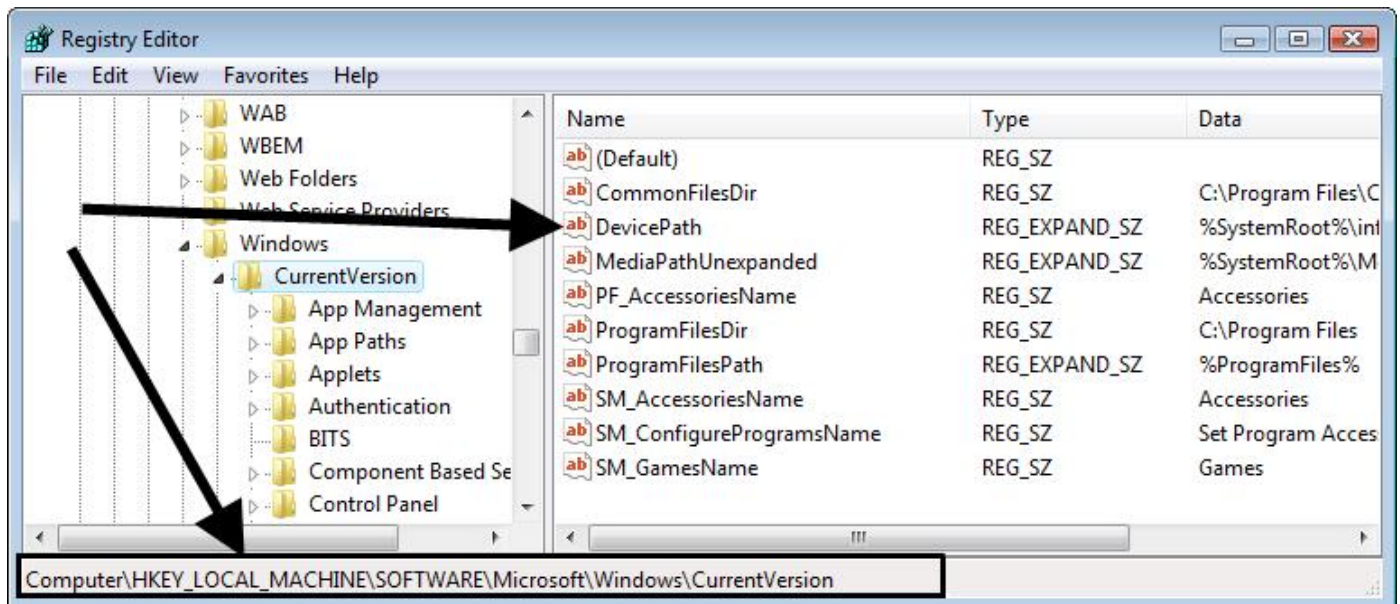
2. In Registry Editor, scroll to the top, left side of the left Window pane – and then navigate to:  
Click **HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE**  
Then scroll down and click **Software**  
Then scroll down and click **Microsoft**  
Then scroll down and click **Windows**  
Then scroll down and click **CurrentVersion**

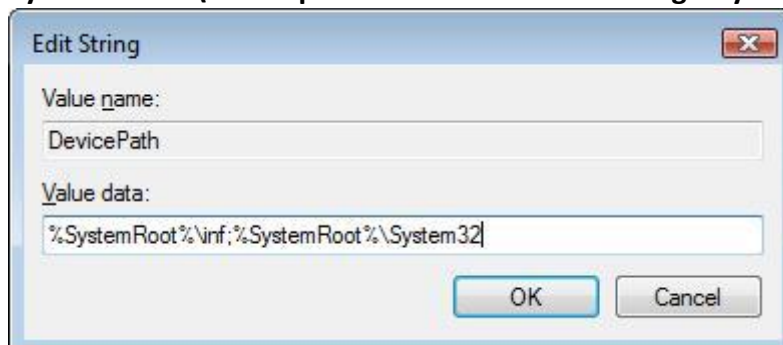

- In the details pane, double-click Device Path.
- Add a semi-colon to end of the existing text, and then add the path to %SystemRoot%\System32. The result should be similar to: %SystemRoot%\inf;%SystemRoot%\System32

**Do not remove the %SystemRoot%\inf file path from the DevicePath registry entry.**



- Click OK to save the new value, and then close Registry Editor.
- If the cable is plugged in, unplug the cable, reboot the computer, plug it back in after reboot, then you will be able to use the adapter.
